## GET INVOLVED!

The Living Archive of Aboriginal Languages contains stories in Indigenous languages of the Northern Territory.

There are materials from over 25 different languages, many with English translations.

You can read the books online, or download them and print them. You can view the archive on any computer, tablet or phone with an internet connection.

Every book has a PDF and a plain text version, with a picture of the cover.

Use the map to find a particular place or language and discover what materials there are.

You can browse by Language, Place, Person or Title.

You can search for a particular book or word or person, or a combination.

You can help us bring the archive to life by

- Using the stories in the classroom or out in the community
- Helping us find people who created the books and ask their permission to put the books in the archive
- Telling us about other materials in NT languages that can go in the archive
- Adding information about the books (names of people involved, translations of titles, etc)
- Recording a native speaker reading the stories
- Recording your stories about the books or the people involved in creating the books
- Helping us find and correct mistakes (in people's names for example, or errors in the texts)
- Giving us feedback about how we can make it better
